



European contact making seminar Youth work versus Euroscepticism

The project aims:

Strengthening collaboration at European level between organizations active in the development of youth activities to combat Euroscepticism.

Objectives:

- Development of the European partnership between 11 youth organizations from 11 countries based on increasing the quality in future youth projects to support European solidarity;
- Increasing the capacity of youth workers to bring added value in raising awareness on European identity valuing media tools specific for written media, radio and TV;
- Supporting the initiation of four youth projects developed in European partnership as a concrete way of action in favor of diminishing the risk of Euroscepticism among youth.

Working Methods:

The seminar is based on methods specific to non-formal education and includes:

- team building activities,
- TV show simulation on presentations of organizations,
- role play on common good practices in the youth activity of partners,
- brainstorming and presentation of Erasmus + Program,
- writing Erasmus + projects,
- laboratory of projects to promote European identity and reach disadvantaged groups,
- mindmap: Euroscepticism in Europe,
- workshop on creating media tools to promote European identity: press release, radio spot, TV spot,
- practical visit to Radio and TV institutions in Iasi - how to use media tools in youth activity,
- workshop for dissemination and development of organizational capacity,
- walk and talk on development of the international dimension of youth activity of partners,
- intercultural activities.
